I begin to be quite inconsolable at not hearing from you — I have not received a letter from England these 6 months — this time I have not written to any one during that time except you — I obtained permission to go to Sorrent as I told you in my letters from thence, which letters perhaps you never received. & about 6 weeks ago I obtained permission to return to Paris I find I have lost two letters, which were directed to me Hotel de Paris & sent to me by a servant, but never arrived. I have tried to recover them, but not yet succeeded, perhaps one of them was from you. Most of the English prisoners of war, have been sent to Verdun — I am at present among the few excepted — I have no hopes of a peace; I wish I may be mistaken. I wrote to you before I left Paris to go to Sorrent. Did you receive the letter? Pray write to me as soon as you receive this Direct to me Hotel de Paris rue de la Loi, Paris.

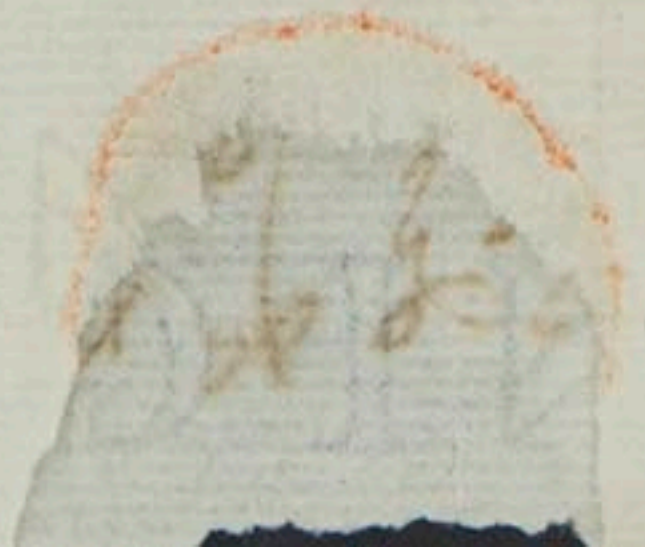
