declare this to be my last Will, I hereby give and devise all my
Lands Hereditaments Goods and Chattels moneys and real and
personal Estate unto Basil Montagu of Bedford Square Esquire,
and my Friend Thomas Manning their Heirs Executors Administrators
and assigns (according to the nature of the premises) Upon Trust to
collect & get in all the personal Estate & either convert the same
into money or not at their discretion & pay the annual interest &
produce thereof unto (or allow the same to be enjoyed by) my
wife during her life & after her death Upon trust to stand &
possess of the same for the benefit of my Daughter for her
life & after her death In trust for such person as she shall by
will or her will appoint Nevertheless it is my especial request
I do hereby authorize my said Trustees the survivor of them
and the Heirs Execs or Admirors of such survivor in case my

Daughter shall marry That they do & shall settle and secure
any said real personal Estate (subject to the Estates for life therein
of my said Daughter & wife successively) so that the same may be
equally divided amongst the children of my said Daughter if
more than one & if only one unto such one child with such other
provisions as my said Trustees or Trustee may think
proper for the benefit of my said Daughter & her Child or
children in regard to any Plate & also my personal Estate at
Cramond I wish the same to be excepted from the above gift
& transferred at once unto my Daughter for her own sole and
