


Denver June 16th 1790-

Dear Manning, I am just arrived here, and find, as usual, that I have forgotten half what I came to Cambridge for. Will you be kind enough to supply my omission by going to Grubb and getting in my name 1 doz. trolling hooks of different sizes but none of them exorbitantly large; let 2 or 3 of them be of this shape  and be sure that in none of them the hooks stand too wide from the lead. They must all be fixed to gimps, not to wire.

Besides this I must beg you to send me Isaac Walton's Complete Angler which you will find somewhere among my books. Send them by the next coach wh. sets off at 3 o'clock on Tuesd.
